A new TV has been authorized by the Executive Committee with the same hope in mind. With these hopes for improvement, the Post should be able to remain on a sound financial footing throughout this coming fiscal year.

He could only hit it about 10-15 feet and the dirt on the infield was soft and almost impossible to push the walker through. So his mother would hold him from behind while he pushed the walker and they "ran" to 1st base. Obviously he never ever made it to first...but still had a big smile on his face. One game, toward the end of the season, I saw the coaches conferring between innings. I think they must have agreed to see that Robert made it at least to 1st base one time. When he hit the ball, the throw to 1st was wild and Robert and his mother made it to 1st base...Big Smile. As it would happen the next few batters up were good hitters or were walked and Robert and mom made it to 2nd, then 3rd, and finally home! REALLY BIG SMILE and both teams and the fans for both teams cheered him all the way around. I think this is something he will never ever forget. And I'm sure many others will find it hard to forget too.

We couldn't continue to do this without your help. There isn't a lot we can do for our deployed Troops to make their lives easier and let them know we care...but these monthly Care Packages sure help. The next packing date is September 12. **We are changing the time for packing Care packages to 11:00.** 

IT'S STILL VERY HOT IN IRAQ AND AFGHANISTAN. We will continue sending Neck Coolers in our Care Packages another couple of months. If you sew and would like to make Neck Coolers please let me know. I have the pattern and crystals to put inside if you need them. I want to thank who ever gave us the helmet liners. I wish I had a name so I could thank you personally. We will start sending them in our Care Packages in about November. We can always use more helmet liners.

**CELL PHONES FOR SOLDIERS:** We are an official collection site for CELL PHONES FOR SOLDIERS. There is a container just outside the door at the Post to deposit cell phones that are no longer being used. The cell phones are sent for recycling and the money is used to purchase Phone Cards for the soldiers. So far we have sent approximately 1,800 phone cards in our Care Packages. These Phone Cards can be used for calling from Iraq, Afghanistan, etc to the US or within the US.

What is a Veteran: A Veteran...whether active duty, discharged, retired, or reserve...is someone who, at one point in their life, wrote a blank check made payable to "The United States of America" for an amount of "up to, and including his/her life." That is honor, and there are way too many people in this country today, who no longer understand that act..
